



MADISAN 75 EPA Label Revision Announcement September 17, 2008 from Steve Hale

Effective Tuesday September 23, 2008, all new production mixes of **MADISAN 75** will be labeled with a revised EPA label. This sanitizer/disinfectant, which contains 7.5% active quaternary ammonium compounds, has eighteen (18) new organisms listed on the label. Eight (8) of the new organisms were added as a result of interest and direct request from our equine program customers. The label also contains several new claims and the format has been altered to list the sanitization claims first followed by the disinfection claims.

NEW ORGANISMS

Food Contact **Sanitizing** (found page 1, column 3):

Aeromonas hydrophilia
Enterococcus faecalis Vancomycin Resistant
Enterobacter sakazakii
Klebsiella pneumoniae
Salmonella typhi
Shigella sonnei
Staphylococcus aureus Methicillin Resistant

Animal Premise **Virucidal** (found page 2, column 3):

Equine Influenza A (H3N8) virus
Equine Herpes Virus Type 1
Canine Coronavirus
Infectious Laryngotracheitis virus

Virucidal (found page 2, columns 1 and 2):

Avian influenza/Turkey/Wisconsin

Disinfection – Hospitals and other Health Care Institutions (found page 2, column 2):

Rhodococcus equi
Salmonella enterica serovar agona
Salmonella enterica serovar anatum
Salmonella enterica serovar Newport
Salmonella enterica serovar typhimurium
Streptococcus equi

Additional changes to the EPA label include the following:

MADISAN 75 contains no phosphorus.

Sanitization claims precede disinfection claims.

Food contact sanitizing directions for dairies and for dishes, silverware, glasses, cooking utensils, eating utensils and other similar size food processing equipment are for 150-200ppm active.

Entryway sanitizing directions are included for 400-800ppm active.

Glove dip sanitizing directions are on the label for 150ppm active.

This label is not approved for use in California.
